Nursery

Take part in simple pretend play, using an object to represent something else.

Listen attentively, move to and talk about music, expressing their feelings and responses.

Recognise differences and sameness.

Understanding of the World

Reception

Continue to develop positive attitudes regarding differences and similarities.



Increasingly able to use and remember sequences and patterns of movements which are related to music and rhythm. Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.

Physical Development



This half term we are looking at healthy eating habits and keeping our bodies healthy. Children will be engaging with various activities which will help them better understand the importance of embracing healthier habits.

Nursery

Link numerals and amounts: for example, showing the right number of objects to match the numeral, up to 5. Mathematics

Explore number composition, 2D shapes, mass and capacity.

Use some of their phonic knowledge in their early writing. Begin to recognise my name.

Reception

Nurserv

Recognise and write my name 'independently'.
Use my phonic skills to sound out/write CVC words (mat, pig, sat...)

Nursery

Become more outgoing with new people within the safe context of their setting.

Reception

Do not always need an adult to remind them of a rule.
