Oracy Update - Miss Wall

This year, we will kick start our Oracy and P4C skills with our two 'talk targets':

- Active listening children will be reminded to show eye-contact and positive body-language when listening to other people talk. We will also think about the importance of not talking over each other and thinking about responses.
- The 'Instigator' role through this talk role, we will focus on sentence stems to start a conversation, such as, 'Can I start by saying...', 'Firstly, I would like to say...', 'my initial thoughts are...', 'Having considered the evidence, I think that...'







Year 1 Update - Miss Pink

Year One children used mirrors to carefully look at our own faces and draw self-portraits. We learnt the word OBSERVE and later we went to the allotment to do observational drawings of the plants there.

It's been great to welcome the children back and to hear their thoughts and feelings about returning to school after such a long time. The teachers and Place2Be have been encouraging children to check-in with their feelings using the Zones of Regulation as they begin to settle back into school life.


