Next week, Class 4 will be joining Class 5 to form a new bubble. Class 6 will now not be paired with another bubble.


Tower Hamlets Poetry Slam


St. John's Musician of the Week...

Miles Davis

Miles Dewey Davis III (May 26, 1926 - September 28, 1991) was an American trumpeter, bandleader, and composer. He is among the most influential and acclaimed figures in the history of jazz and 20th-century music. Miles' music changed direction and form over his five-decade career, and this kept him at the forefront of many major stylistic developments in jazz. He performed and recorded pieces with Jazz greats such as John Coltrane, and he was still an influence after his death in 1991. In 2006, Davis was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, which recognized him as "one of the key figures in the history of jazz", and many have described him as one of the most important musicians of the 20th century. Hopefully you'll get to listen to some of his amazing jazz music this week

The overwhelming majority of parents/carers who responded found our methods of communication either useful or very useful. In particular parents/carers were positive about phone calls, text messages and emails.

It is of note that fewer respondees thought that twitter and the school website were applicable to them.

These bar shows the average rating of how well the school kept parents carers informed and how useful the regular check-in phone calls from staff were. Overall, the results show that parents/carers felt that the school did keep them informed and the check in calls were useful.

In terms of communication, what did the school do well?

- Nothing! Communication has been poor from March 2020

In terms of communication, what could the school do better?

- Bit more detail
- I guess in situations like this not much can be done as Government making decisions
- I think we could be making more use of the school website if we had a page for parents with all the links on they might need and events in a calendar there and a page for children in each class with all their links on. This could become a go to place and could show great photos for others to find. It would also then build a picture for others who look at our website that we are a thriving school community!
- Give sufficient notice when proposing any changes
- Nothing! The whole senior team, Teachers and admin staff were all brilliant!
- Keeping parents informed with relevant and correct information. Follow up with parents when they have an enquiry or an issue (Because they don't) from my persona experience
- They did everything they could in the circumstances they were under

Summary of Communication Findings:

The overall majority of parents/carents reported that the school communicated effectively. Our Senior Leadership Team will look into the following:

- Consider how we can make adjustments to our website
- Advertise our website more prominently
- Advertise twitter so parents/carers understand the relevance of it
