Awinspired, Year 5 studied the architectural design of the 'roofless' garden discovering Crossrail Place sits almost exactly on the Meridian line! As part of the project, Year 5 we're extremely fortunate to visit the amazing skyscraper, Canada Tower. Children travelled all the way up to Level 30, where they able to see a panoramic view of the whole city and study all the different types of buildings, looking at their size, colour and material.
