Important Message from the Chair of Governors

As you know, **Terry Bennett**, the Federation's Executive Headteacher, is retiring at the end of August. Earlier this year, the school governors, with help and advice from Tower Hamlets Education Partnership and the London Diocesan Board, began the process of finding a successor.

In doing so, governors were clear that the needs of our current and future pupils would be at the centre of any decision. Also, in order to continue to provide first-class schools to our local communities, the following guiding principles were agreed:

- Preservation and fostering of current good relationships, leading to a sense of belonging and trust with pupils, staff and parents/carers;
- Stability, combined with development in an uncertain future;
- Continuity with sustained improvements;
- Opportunities for development and growth of suitable staff already within the system;
- An awareness of the current budgetary constraints on the schools.

I am pleased to announce that, following his successful interview yesterday, Mr **Darren Rubin** will succeed Terry Bennett as our new Executive Headteacher from 1st September 2023.

Musician of the Fortnight Update

This fortnight, we continue our listening journey of music by incredible female composers and musicians. With Ramadan and Eid on the horizon, we listen to a recommendation from Ms Khatun. Runa Laila (born 17th November 1952) is a Bangladeshi playback singer and composer, and her voice will be familiar to many of our children of Bengali heritage. A playback singer is someone who records songs to be mimed by actors in films.


Runa started her career in the Pakistan film industry in the late 1960s. Her distinctive style of singing can be heard in a range of films – The Rain (1976), Jadur Banshi (1977), Accident (1989), Ontore Ontore (1994), Devdas (2013) and Priya Tumi Shukhi Hou (2014). Her songs have earned her seven Bangladesh National Film Awards for Best Female Playback Singer. In 2018, She won the Best Music Composer award for the film 'Ekti Cinemar Golpo' and she is still working behind the scenes for films even today.
