



High Standards at St John's

I am delighted to report that once again, St John's students have produced some very favourable outcomes in the recent examinations mostly higher than National and Local Tower Hamlets averages:

- In the Early Years, children who have achieved a Good Level of Development at St John's is above Local and National averages,
- Children who passed their phonics tests at St John's is over 10% higher than local and National average scores.
- In Key Stage 1, children at St John's achieving the expected standard for Reading, Writing and Mathematics once again beat National and Tower Hamlets averages,
- At Key Stage 2, Reading Writing, Grammar and Mathematics are higher than our counterparts Nationally and higher or broadly in line with Tower Hamlets scores.
- Our combined scores for children achieving Expected Standard in Reading Writing and Maths was higher than National and Local Tower Hamlets scores.









Acts of Kindness

As I already mentioned, Compassion is our Value of the Term and this was very evident with a number of our pupils. I am delighted to say that the one of our children was given a Headteacher's Award for giving up his time before going out to lunch to make sure that all of the chairs in the lunch hall had been pushed in. 
