



Reinhardt Buhr

Over this Easter period, Reinhardt Buhr is our Musician of the Fortnight. Reinhardt Buhr (born in 1988) is originally from Johannesburg, South Africa. He is an incredible multi-instrumentalist, which means he is skilled at playing many instruments. Aged only 36 years, Reinhardt has composed 16 albums and in the process of creating more.

At the end of 2019, his music went viral through social media, averaging over 4 million views per month, and the numbers continue to rise. Reinhardt combines the Guitar, Electric Cello, Australian didgeridoo, Israeli Shofar, Spanish Cajon, and the Piano to create an extraordinary orchestra in his own one-man improvisational band. Listen carefully and see if you can recognise some of them. I hope you enjoy listening to his evocative music this fortnight.



- Providing information about other support services and departments


Our team also runs workshops for parents around the EHCP process, Annual Reviews, and Secondary School Transitions.
