#### Summary of PPG Spending 2015/16

#### **Objectives in spending PPG:**

At St John's we acknowledge that all children will make the best progress by having the best teaching; we have had a focus on improving learning for all by promoting 'Quality First' teaching in all classrooms. We have invested in training our teachers with a focus on all areas of the curriculum but particularly writing. We believe that this will ensure we continue to have a minimal gap, if any, in the progress and attainment of children who qualify for the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG). Additionally, we believe that if children are to be in the best position for learning, their social, emotional and health needs should also be addressed so that pupils are able to get on with each other and enjoy their time in school. We analysed the needs of our children to 'fine tune' our provision, targeting classes, groups and individuals as appropriate, this analysis was repeated at pupil progress meetings between members of SLT and teachers each half term. We believe that strengthening the relationship between parents/carers and the school is also fundamental to good learning and our Home School Liaison worker has worked hard to develop and improve parents' understanding of children's learning and the teaching methods used.

Finally, we wanted to promote and develop children's creative awareness by providing a range of after school clubs and educational visits/school visitors.

#### Summary of spending and actions taken:

Needs analysis carried out following data from RAISE on line and also using the school tracker, PPG funding was allocated and individuals identified for support. Funding has been used to:

- Provide an additional experienced teacher to support a group of lower attaining Year 5 pupils in smaller classes for numeracy and literacy 5 mornings a week for the year.
- Develop language skills across the school by providing specialist support SaLT for 1 day a week.
- Support emotional development by providing a school counselling service Place2 Be.
- Employ a full-time Health Mentor to encourage improved learning behaviours in class and encouraging healthy development both physically and emotionally in the playground.
- Continue to fund the Home School Liaison worker, librarian and breakfast club
- Fund extra TA support to provide interventions during the afternoon
