

St John's CE Primary School- Pupil Premium Expenditure 2017/18

At St John's School we have identified three main areas of need which impact children's learning so we are spending out PPG on trying to address some of the issues that are some of the causes that impact our children. We have a much higher than average rate of children in receipt of PPG – 61.3%, only two other schools in Tower Hamlets have a higher percentage of children qualifying for PPG. Our grant for the year is **£150,480**
