Online Safety Workshops Update – Ms Moses

We're pleased to be inviting back 'Perform' in October to bring us some exciting drama-based workshops and help bring the topic of Online Safety to life. Linked to the National Curriculum and the 'Zip It, Block It, Flag It' campaign, the workshops will deliver the necessary key messages, specially tailored to each age range.

In KS1 the children will become Cyber Superheroes, going on an adventure where they learn about internet safety through making good choices. In KS2 children will become Digital Detectives using drama to explain the importance of keeping our details safe and understanding potential issues and when to question them.




JOINING ZOOM VIA EMAIL INVITATION Via Email sent by a teacher, school staff or other professional Click the JOIN LINK in your email or calendar invitation. You may be prompted to open Zoom meeting into the control of the control

If you receive an email invitation then you just need to click on the link. You may need to wait for the meeting host to start the meeting, but they always try to start on time.

HOW TO USE ZOOM FOR MEETINGS

Waiting for the Host (teacher/staff) to Start the Meeting:

If the staff have not started broadcasting (meaning he/she is not yet on your screen), you'll receive something similar as the following message (see right image). Just patiently wait a few minutes for them to start.



DURING THE MEETING



You as the parent/carer have a few controls during the meeting. Here are a few common ones:

- CHAT: You can open a chat window by clicking CHAT. This is a great feature to have in case someone's speakers aren't working or are not on. You can alert each other via CHAT if you can't hear one another.
- RAISE HAND: You could tap the RAISE HAND button while the teacher/staff is speaking in case you have a question about something that he/she is discussing or working on with your child. This alerts your teacher/staff that you need them when theyhas a moment.

PATIENCE: Technology works great...when it works! Patience and understanding is so important when starting out with something new like this.
