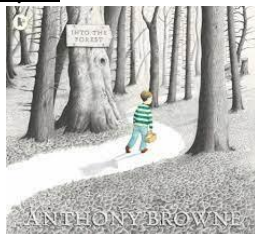

English - Fiction -Fairy Tales & Playscripts

To read and understand 'Into the Forest'.
Understand the sequence of a fairy tale and write their own.
To convert the fairy tale into a playscript.
Children to act out their stories, growing in confidence performance and speaking aloud using our oracy skills.



Outcomes:

Children will be able to:
Write coherently about a fairy tale and follow the structure and sequence.
To use third person and present tense in their writing for non-fiction.

Maths - Mass & Capacity and Money

To be confident in using a range of measuring equipment.
To convert measurements into different units.
To understand kg, g, ml and l.
To add and subtract measurements.
To convert pounds (£) and pence.
To add and subtract money.

Outcomes:

Children will be able to:
Be confident in using units
Interpret mathematical vocabulary to answer word problems involving money and measures

Art & Topic - Fantasy & Surrealism

Outcomes:

To understand the life and works of influential artists who used fantasy and surrealism in their artwork.
Produce creative artwork.



PHSE - Relationships

To learn about different relationships in our world - families, friends, being a citizen in our world.

Outcomes: To have a clear understanding of the qualities needed to have secure relationships in our world.

Religious Education - Christianity - Believing

Why is the Bible important to Christians??

We are learning to explore what the Bible says and how the Bible is used and valued in the Christian community.

Outcomes

Children will know how Christians use the Bible in their everyday life. They will also learn stories from the Bible.

Outcomes: Children will be able to:

How Can You Help?

Maths: Please help your child to practise their times tables. We should know the 2, 5 and 10 times tables by the end of year 2 and the 3, 4 and 8 times tables by the end of year 3!

Reading: Children are expected to read every night. Supplementary reading is always advised.

Homework: Children will receive homework for English/Maths every Friday, and should return it school on the following Monday in order for it to be marked. Homework tasks are a direct follow on from that week's learning to allow for consolidation.
