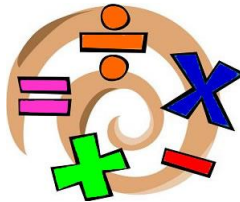


Maths **Multiplication & Division**

Outcomes: Children will be able to:
Count in 6s, 7s, and 9s.
Recall multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables to 9.
Use knowledge of place value, multiplication and division facts to multiply and divide numbers mentally.
Recognise the relationship between multiplication and division.
Use written methods to multiply 2 or 3 digit numbers by a 1 digit number.
Answer word problems using multiplication and division.

Outcomes: Children will be able to:
Explore features of an adventure story.
Empathise with characters, explaining their behaviour and feelings.
Act out the roles of different characters in the novel.
Discuss words and phrases that capture readers' interest and imagination.
Use dialogue to advance the action.
Write a diary entry in role.
Write their own adventure story.



Topic **Explorers and Adventurers**
