

Maths

To understand place value of numbers up to 10 million
To solve problems involving large numbers and decimals.
To solve word problems using appropriate methods.
To use written methods for complex mixed operations

Outcomes: Children will be able to:

Use a range of methods when adding, subtracting multiplying/dividing.
Solve a range of word problems (involving both measurement and real life problems.)
Apply their knowledge of decimals to solve related word problems.

To identify the features of a genre/text type - journalistic writing, diary
Writing and historical fiction.
To experiment with and use a range of advanced punctuation appropriately.
To use different forms of verbs in different contexts.

Outcomes: Children will be able to:

Write using punctuation and appropriate grammatical features to control the meaning and pace of the piece of writing.
Plan for each text type we are covering and understand how to use their plan.
